

The Word for Today

God can cancel your past (1) 'He cancelled the record of the charges against us.' Colossians 2:14 NLT

Jesus 'cancelled the record of the charges against us ... by nailing it to the cross.' The word 'cancel' means to remove, to neutralise, to offset something. Have you ever got most of the way through a project and wished you could start over? Suppose you were painting the lounge, and you stepped back and looked at the colour on the sample chart. On the wall, however, it doesn't look the same. You wish you could redo it. Many of us feel that way about life, as one author describes it: 'I've made so many mistakes. I wish I could just wipe them out and start over.' Failures, problems, bad decisions – we have all suffered from them. But some people can't let go of the past, and, as a result, they let their past limit their present opportunities. They live in a constant state of regret, continually lamenting, 'If only I hadn't done that' or 'If only I had made these changes.' They repeatedly secondguess themselves. And they are tormented by painful memories. 'I blew it, and I'm going to be paying for it for the rest of my life.' You may choose to carry guilt, but you don't have to! The moment you put your trust in Christ, He 'cancels the record' of your past. Actually, you no longer have a past; you only have a future! You can lay down, once and for all, your heavy load of guilt, old hurts, and memories of mistakes. Jesus 'took it away by nailing it to the cross'. God has promised to '... blot out your sins ... and will never think of them again.' (Isaiah 43:25 NLT). You must too!

Minnipa Nite Owls has been operating for a few years now and has grown in popularity every year, especially in 2023. The program aims to bring the community together, introduce people to bowls, provide a social opportunity and raise much needed money for the Club. The program has increased the Club's social membership ten fold, and allowed them to provide a significant local financial contribution towards the installation of a synthetic surface; something they have been working hard to achieve over the past 10 years.

Special Commendation: Wudinna Area School, Governing Council, Staff & Students

GAWLER RANGES NATIONAL PARK UPDATE

FEBRUARY 2023



BEES

The importance of bees to agriculture cannot be underestimated as we all know. They have become crucial for the pollination of crops and flowering plants. Not so well realised however is that our native bees are equally as effective in pollination but unfortunately have been vastly outcompeted by the more aggressive introduced European Honey Bee (brought into Australia in the early 1800's). Native Bees are also known as Stingless Bees as they don't sting, so pose no threat to humans. There are many different species, one of the best known perhaps is the Blue-banded Bee (pictured above on a Flax Lily, *Dianella revoluta*). Native bees are also known to hive and produce honey but their numbers have greatly diminished.

Of concern to the National Park is that the European Bee has been particularly prevalent this year and in dangerously high numbers around the campgrounds. As a result we have even had to close the Scrubby Peak camping ground due to the number of complaints from visitors. Known hives have been treated and warnings have been installed throughout the Park as well as the 'ParkSA' website for people booking online. This however, has not lessened our concern and treatment of known hives will continue throughout the summer months.

BUFFEL GRASS

Another introduced species of concern is Buffel Grass. A huge effort has been made by National Park staff in collaboration with staff at the Hiltaba Nature Reserve to try and reduce the spread of Buffel Grass along the Hiltaba to Kingoonya Road. This road acts as a corridor for the movement of seed and it is important to control its spread to try and prevent it from infiltrating the Gawler Ranges. We have mapped 25 sites, along 80km of road, totalling approximately 40 hectares. Some sections along the roadside have large clusters of plants, whilst some are lineal infestations along the road edge and some are just isolates. Buffel is a declared weed in SA and has devastated natural systems throughout Australia. It has the ability to establish very quickly and dominate the landscape. Buffel Grass burns very hot and regularly, which can quickly reduce the native plant seed bank (the big fires in Alice Springs and Tennant Creek this summer were all fuelled by Buffel Grass). Loss of native plants can quickly lead to a reduction in biodiversity. For this reason it is a grass we definitely do not need in the Gawler Ranges landscape.

WILDFIRES

With plenty of the summer still to come we have already had 6 wildfires in the park. All the fires were started from dry lightning strikes. The first fire before Christmas, located 2.5km west of Old Paney, consumed approximately 25 hectares before staff managed to suppress it. Fortunately it started alongside the Old Paney Scenic Route so fire appliances could rapidly extinguish the flames. The other 5 fires started between Christmas and New Year all on the same day as a severe dry storm passed through. These fires were located at Little Pinbong Swamp, Baggy Green, Boundary Track, Locke Claypan and the National Park boundary and the western side of Sturts Lake. Apart from the Lockes Claypan fire, vehicle access was very limited and most of the fires were extinguished using hand tools.

It was a tough week at the fires but we were very fortunate that the weather was on our side allowing us the right conditions to quickly suppress them.

Thank you, to all those people who attended and provided support.

GOAT CONTROL

The Gawler Ranges National Park will be closed from the 29th January through to the 5th February whilst the Australian Sporting Shooters Association undertake another Feral Goat control program.

So far this summer we have removed approximately over 3000 goats.

FREE Child Development Checks

sahealth.sa.gov.au/eyreandfarnorthlhn

What are they?

Child development checks assess important areas of a child's development, such as communication, motor skills, problem solving and social/emotional development.

These checks are conducted by a trained professional (Registered Nurse or Aboriginal Children's Health and Development Practitioner).

Why are they important?

A child development check can identify your child's strengths as well as areas where your child may need additional support during their early years.

It is recommended that children have at least three development checks from birth to 5 years around the milestones ages of: 6 months, 12 months, 18–24 months, 3 years and 4–5 years. If you consent for your child to receive a check:

- a trained health professional will conduct a free development check with you and your child.
- you will receive personal and confidential feedback summarising the outcome of your child's check.

If the check identifies your child would benefit from further support, the team can assist with referrals to allied health professionals, paediatrician/s or other community agencies.

Landscape Officer Update—February 2024

Fox Bait Distribution Days

Due to the recording of fox numbers steadily increasing, I have organised two fox distribution days for the 15th and 16th of February. Please find the locations, times and important information below.

Please send me an e-mail or text to register your interest at any of the locations mentioned. If these times do not suit you, please contact me to arrange an alternative time.

It is recommended to bait throughout the year with a focus on a few months before lambing – often late summer and autumn for Eyre Peninsula livestock producers; and again during fox breeding season in spring.

Land managers are reminded to bring along a bucket with a sealable lid when collecting baits. The baits are frozen meat which is best kept frozen until use. Land managers will also be required to provide the section numbers for the properties they intend to bait.

If a landholder is intending to send a third party to collect their baits, please contact us in advance so that the correct paperwork can be completed and we are able to facilitate the distribution.

Alternative commercially produced fox baits such as Fox Off may also be purchased. If this is something you are interested in, please contact me prior to the day.

EFTPOS facilities and contactless payment will be available and NO cash will be accepted. Bait are sold at \$24 per bag of 20 at distribution days, discounted from \$30.

Summer Weed

As we head into the hotter months coupled with the rain, the summer weeds are making their appearances once again. Last month, I spent time travelling and surveying along the Eyre Hwy from Lake Gilles to Wudinna and this is the perfect time to get on top of these summer grasses and implementing control methods.

African Lovegrass, Innocent weed, Buffel grass and Fountain grass are among the worst offenders on this list, all of which has been observed along the highway. Landholders and residents have a responsibility to remove pest plants from their properties with the aim of containing the spread of these weeds across the whole peninsula. The Weed Control Handbook for Declared Plants in South Australia offers advice on suitable herbicides and rates. A copy of the handbook is available in the weeds section of PIRSA's website at www.pir.sa.gov.au.

Landholders should always read the label of any herbicide to ensure it is suitable for its intended purpose and can be used safely. Care should be taken to avoid herbicide contact with native plants and any spraying of herbicide in native vegetation should be left to qualified bush care operators.

I encourage all also reach out to myself or anyone else on the EP Landscape Board to notify of any plants, even if you are not sure of the species. As we all know, the Eyre Peninsula is quite a substantial area and the more eyes on it means better

outcomes for all that call here home.






